Complaints to the BBC: February 2013

The BBC answered just over **13,500** complaints from the audience during February 2013. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

Changes to the content of parts of the BBC's Red Button service and some technical problems as the final switch over from Ceefax took place caused complaints this month.

We've also received complaints from some viewers who felt the presenter made an inappropriate comment at the end of Let's Dance for Comic Relief concerning England's chances of success against France in the Six Nations Rugby.

Finally, we continued to receive complaints about the decision to reschedule Sunday religious programming on BBC Radio 2 to 6am, with Sunday Half Hour no longer being broadcast at 8.30pm.
