

Complaints to the BBC: March 2013

The BBC answered just over **19,300** complaints from the audience during March 2013. These ranged from a small number of complaints about alleged breaches of editorial guidelines through to a much larger collection of views about programme content and services.

There were complaints from viewers who felt some of the content during Comic Relief: Funny for Money was offensive, with a number also objecting to bad language transmitted before the watershed.

We also received complaints about The Mystery of Mary Magdalene, where some viewers felt the content was inaccurate and offensive to Christian beliefs and/or should not have been broadcast on Good Friday.

Finally, we received complaints from viewers who felt Eddie Mair was biased against and / or rude and aggressive to Boris Johnson during their interview on the Andrew Marr Show.
