- 5. CLARE Have you planned the funeral yet?
- 6. CLIENT No, I've not really given it any thought...
- 7. CLARE There's an environmentally friendly undertakers in the High Street called Going, Going Green. Can't recommend them too highly, although avoid the cardboard coffins. They can turn a bit too biodegradable if it rains. If you know what I mean.

CLIENT WAILS

8. CLARE Cheerio.

CLIENT LEAVES, STILL SOBBING.

9. FX CLARE'S FOOTSTEPS / DOOR CLOSES / OFFICE ATMOS OUT

- 10. CLARE Sorry I'm late for the team meeting, everyone, my interview ran over.
- 11. LIBBY No probs, Clare. Pull up a seat. Where were we?

1.	MEGAN	The removal of the water cooler from the corridor; where are we going to gather to discuss it?
2.	LIBBY	Good point. All suggestions gratefully accepted. Yes, Ray.
3.	RAY	I would like some advice regarding Dexter, my client on remand. I don't know what to do to help him?
4.	LIBBY	Call his brief, get him to accentuate Dexter's positive qualities.
5.	RAY	Dexter was caught in the act of robbing a post office. What positive qualities?
6.	LIBBY	He managed to find a Post Office, didn't he? That's pretty impressive. Next, Helen
7.	HELEN	Yes, team leader.
8.	LIBBY	Just a small point, but can you stop telling clients in the Trauma Support Group to "Cheer up, it might never happen"?
9.	HELEN	But they're such a bunch of downers.
10	. LIBBY	Whatever. Megan? You wanted to say something?
11.	. MEGAN	Regarding Clare's wedding present
12.	. LIBBY	Hold it, Megan, the woman is sitting right here in the room!
13	. MEGAN	Credit me with some discretion, Libby, I'm not about to tell Clare what the present is! But can anyone who's not put in their pound do it by the end of the day.

1. MEGAN We can sort the change out next week. 2. HELEN Continuing on the theme... 3. LIBBY Yes, Helen... 4. HELEN It's about your Hen night tonight, Clare. I've got it all planned. 5. CLARE Oh yes, spill the beans. 6. 7. NURSE	Do you have any body piercings?
8. BRIAN	No.
9. NURSE	Do you have any tattoos?
10. BRIAN	No.
11. NURSE	Have you ever travelled through or lived in a tropical destination?
12. BRIAN	No.
PAUSE	
13. NURSE	Blimey, you're boring.
14. BRIAN	Do you think so?
15. NURSE	Yes I do. OK, you're going to feel a little prick.
16. BRIAN	I already do feel
17. NURSE	Stop there. Please, try not to be boring AND predictable.

1. BRIAN Sorry.

SCENE 4: INT. THE FLAT. EVENING

1. <u>FX</u>	RAIN OUTSIDE / INTERIOR DOOR OPENS
2. CLARE	So, Nali, what do you think?
3. NALI	This is your wedding outfit?
4. CLARE	Yes.
5. NALI	The clothes you will wear to your wedding tomorrow?
6. CLARE	That's right.
7. NALI	The biggest day of your life, the day every girl dreams about, and you will turn up looking like that?
8. CLARE	Yes.
9. NALI	It's not a joke?
10. CLARE No.	
PAUSE	
11. NALI	It's lovely.
12. CLARE	Thank you.
13. <u>FX</u>	CHINA PLATES KNOCKING TOGETHER
14. CLARE	Hey, be careful polishing those. They're a wedding present.
15. NALI	I'm being careful!

 CLARE They're my most treasured possession. My Mum bought me them as a wedding present.

2. NALI So you said. Although I still do not understand why your Mother should buy you a set of plates commemorating hideously ugly people.

3. CLARE Actually, Nali, the plates commemorate all the post–war Labour Party leaders.

4. NALI Actually my Great Grandmother back home, rest her soul, had a similar collection. Only it was just the one plate, with Comrade Tito on.

5. CLARE Well these are limited edition, so take care.

6. NALI Limited edition or not, you have to admit, Clare, there's not a looker in the bunch. Take this one. To be honest, if I ate my dinner off Margaret Beckett I think I would barf.

7. CLARE Two things, Nali; First, the plates are for decoration, not eating off.

Second, your beloved Conservative Party isn't exactly crammed full of beauties.

8. NALI Now I know you are joking!

9. CLARE No I'm not!

10. NALI Next you will be telling me you don't have David Cameron sex dreams.

11. CLARE I most certainly don't!

12. NALI Or Boris...

1. CLARE	Nali please! Change the subject!
2. NALI	Or both at once. Like last night, I dreamt I was in the Jungle in Boris' arms when David swung through on a vine clutching his manifesto
3. CLARE	Enough! Ugh, ugh!
4. NALI	OK, OK, I shall dwell on it in my spare time. So, how about Brian, what will he be wearing?
5. CLARE	Don't talk to me about Brian, I'm sick of him and his listless, lethargic and lackluster ways. Two hours ago it started raining, and all he's done since is stare vacantly through the window.
6. NALI	Maybe you should think about letting him in.
7. CLARE	Maybe. I don't want him catching cold and sneezing through the ceremony.
8. NALI	I'll go fetch him in.
9. <u>FX</u>	DOOR OPENING, STORM OUTSIDE.
10. NALI	Brian, Brian, come on Brian.
11. CLARE	I can't even see if he's out there.
12. <u>FX</u>	TING, TING, TING, TING, TING
13. CLARE	Nali, what are you doing?

SCENE 5: INT. A PUB. LATER THAT EVENING.

1.	FX	PUB ATMOSPHERE
2.	BRIAN	Good to see you, Simon.
3.	SIMON	You too, Brian. It was nice to get your call. I didn't think you were going to see anybody the night before your wedding.
4.	BRIAN	Yes, well maybe I'm regretting the decision!
5.	SIMON	Well hallelujah you've come to your senses. Marriage isn't for you. Look, I don't mind telling Clare it's off, part of the Best Man's duties
6.	BRIAN	I am not regretting getting married, Simon.
7.	SIMON	Oh. Blast.
8.	BRIAN	But maybe a bloody good stag do is what I need to send me off into wedlock. You know, Tie one on! Run amuck! Spend a night on the tiles painting the town a shade of red that won't fade for years.
9.	SIMON	Pint?
10.	BRIAN	Just a half, thanks mate.
11.	SIMON	Come on, Brian, out with it. What's wrong?
12.	BRIAN	Well, I'm getting married tomorrow and it suddenly seems heavy with significance. It's like a curtain is descending on my life
13.	SIMON	Come on, Brian, it's a marriage. It's not like it's forever.

1.	BRIAN	I want to get married, Simon. But there are so many things I haven't done, experiences I should have ticked off, before settling down.
2.	SIMON	Like what?
3.	BRIAN	Hitch-hiking, scuba diving, snow boarding, paragliding
4.	SIMON	Sex with twins, that's a good one.
5.	BRIAN	Playing the violin, abseiling
6.	SIMON	Triplets, ditto.
7.	BRIAN	I shall never drive through Paris in a sports car, with the warm wind in my hair
8.	SIMON	You could still do the sports car bit.
9.	BRIAN	Do you know what, Simon, I've never even chatted up a woman in a bar.
10.	SIMON	Come on, Brian, be serious.
11.	. BRIAN	I never have, and I never will now. Don't get me wrong. I'm quite prepared to go to the scaffold, I just don't want to go meekly. Punch the priest en route, if you know what I mean?
12.	SIMON	Oh, I know what you mean. In fact I did punch the priest at one of my weddings, didn't go down at all well
13.	BRIAN	Simon, what I am about to tell you is in strictest confidence.
14.	SIMON	Everything you tell me, Brian, is in strictest confidence

1. BRIAN Because it's the night before my wedding!

2. SIMON All the more reason to do it!

PAUSE

3. BRIAN Look, I'm not about to... What the hell! I'll do it!

4. SIMON Proud of you, mate.

5. BRIAN Here goes!

PAUSE

6. SIMON Go on, Brian, what's the problem?

7. BRIAN Simon.... what if I'm successful?

8. SIMON I don't think you have to worry about that. Off you go.

A PAUSE AS BRIAN CROSSES THE BAR.
HE COUGHS DISCREETLY TO ATTRACT HER ATTENTION.

9. NINA Why, hello.

10. BRIAN (FALSETTO, POSSIBLY CRACKING) Hello.

SCENE 6. INT. MORNING. THE REGISTRY OFFICE

1.	FX	REGISTRY OFFICE ATMOS
١.	1 ^	REGISTRY OF FICE ATMOS

2. SIMON Look, Brian, it's OK to be nervous on the morning of your wedding,

but I think you're taking things a bit far.

3. BRIAN It's not the wedding, Simon, its Clare! She'll take one look at me

and know what I did last night. She was too pre-occupied this

morning, but Clare can sniff out guilt at a hundred paces.

- 4. SIMON Relax, she can't possibly know.
- 5. REGISTRAR Hello, I'm Mr. Lane, the Registrar for today's ceremony, this is my

assistant Gavin. I'm showing Gavin the ropes.

- 6. GAVIN You the groom?
- 7. BRIAN That's right.
- 8. GAVIN Bit nervous aren't you?
- 9. BRIAN No.
- 10. GAVIN I'd say you were. Very nervous. In fact you're sweating like a

blacksmith's backside.

- 11. BRIAN It's very close in here.
- 12. GAVIN I notice the bride's not here.
- 13. BRIAN She's still getting ready.
- 14. GAVIN Still sorting out her visa, is she?

- 1. BRIAN Visa?
- 2. GAVIN Well I'm sure you can use the time to practice pronouncing her name properly.
- 3. BRIAN Exactly what are you insinuating?
- 4. GAVIN I've got your number, mate. Or are you going to tell me that she's marrying you for love (UNKIND LAUGH).
- 5. BRIAN Yes, she is! And what's more she was born in Ruislip.
- 6. GAVIN Oh yes? Is that Ruislip in Middlesex or Ruislip in Kazhakstan, say?
- 7. SIMON Is there a Ruislip in Kahakstan?
- 8. REGISTRAR That's enough, Gavin, calm down. I'm so sorry. We got a memo telling registrars to keep a look out for fraudulent marriages, and our Gavin is being a bit over vigilant. Come along, Gavin.
- 9. GAVIN Coming, Boss. (TO BRIAN) I'm watching you, Sonny. There'll be no fake marriages on my watch. Got it?

RAY MAKES AN ANNOUNCEMENT

- 10. RAY

 Ahem! Hello, everybody, I'm Ray the usher. Remember? As you came in I told Bride's friends to the left, Groom's friends to the right.

 Well, right is a bit on the empty side, would some of you mind pretending to be Brian's friends?
- 11. MEGAN Well done, Ray.
- 12. RAY You're looking a bit peaky, Megan.
- 13. MEGAN I have to say, I've felt better.

1. RAY I feel absolutely grotty. I wish I'd changed my clothes when I had the chance.

2. MEGAN You were out all night, Ray, you never had the chance.

3. RAY I meant three days ago.

4. BRIAN Ray, is there any sign of the bride?

5. RAY None at all, Brian.

6. BRIAN Where the hell is Clare? She should be here by now.

SCENE 7: INT. THE FLAT. MORNING

1. CLARE Nali, please, that's enough make-over! I have to go now.

2. NALI Clare, please, it's just a dab of cream. It'll take no time!

3. CLARE Sorry, I've got to go!

4. NALI Have it your way. Brian's first kiss as a married man is with Lech

Walensa.

5. CLARE I'm fine.

6. NALI I love a wedding Clare. You know, in my village we have a

tradition...

7. CLARE I thought you would.

8. NALI The evening before the wedding, a big cart is decorated in

hundreds and hundreds of freshly cut flowers and all the virgins of

the village are driven around the town square.

9. CLARE Sounds fun.

10. NALI It was. But when I was fourteen I wasn't allowed in it anymore.

Hay Fever. Since then the tradition has slowly died, and nowadays

there is just Auntie Branka bouncing around in the back. And Mika

the Milkman says she has no right to be in there.

11. CLARE Go and wait in the car, Nali

12. NALI Very well. First, a hug please.

THEY HUG

1. NALI	You have been a good friend to me Clare. And for that reason I have decided to stay out of any photos, so as not to upstage you in your dowdy dress.
2. CLARE	The car, Nali.
3. NALI	I go.
4. <u>FX</u>	DOORBELL
5. CLARE	Who's that?
6. <u>FX</u>	DOOR OPENS / STREET ATMOS B/G
7. NALI	Yes?
8. NINA	Clare Barker?
9. NALI	No, that's her. (LEAVING) Clare, I see you in the car.
10. NINA	Clare? How nice to meet you after all the things I've heard.
11. CLARE	And you are?
12. NINA	Nina. Nina Murray
13. CLARE	Well I'm sorry, Nina Murray, whatever it is it'll have to wait. I'm about to get married.
14. NINA	That's exactly why it can't wait. You see there's something you

really ought to know; Last night I slept with your fiancée Brian.

- 1. REGISTRAR There isn't any fire alarm.
- 2. HELEN Really? Well that really was a hell of a night we had last night.
- 3. MEGAN Perhaps one of us should go to the flat and see what's happening.
- 4. HELEN I'll go, I could do with some fresh air. I rather regret finishing off the evening drinking the hand gel in the bathroom.
- 5. MEGAN Actually I was thinking of somebody who wasn't... still drunk.
- 6. HELEN I am not drunk, Megan, I'll have you know I am in total control of my faculties. I shall see you all later.
- 7. REGISTRAR This is all very well, but I don't know if there's time...
- 8. RAY Look, Clare has included a couple of her favourite songs for after the ceremony. Let's do them now?
- 9. REGISTRAR Fine. Whatever.

10. FX AT A DISTANCE THE FRANTIC SOUND OF DOOR RATTLING.

- 11. HELEN (OFF) How the bloody hell do you get this stupid door open?
- 12. REGISTRAR You push it, like it says.

13. FX DOOR OPENS

14. HELEN Thank you.

- RAY
 (ANNOUNCES) OK, does everybody have a songsheet? Could the congregation be upstanding as we all sing "Between The Wars" by Billy Bragg.
- 2. FX SHUFFLE OF CHAIRS AND FEET, FOLLOWED BY A CHORD

SCENE 9: INT. THE FLAT. LATER THAT MORNING

1.	FX:	STREET ATMOS B/G
2.	CLARE	I've never heard such utter nonsense.
3.	NINA	It isn't nonsense. Believe me.
4.	CLARE	Brian would never betray me.
5.	NINA	Really? Well what about when he slept with Nali's twin sister Nuli?
6.	CLARE	Brian would never betray me more than once in a year. Besides, how did you know about Nuli?
7.	NINA	Oh you'd be surprised what I know about you. For Brian and I didn't just share a night of wonderful lovemaking, we talked. And Brian needed to talk. A lot.
8.	CLARE	I am about to get married to Brian. Now get out of the way.
9.	NINA	I don't think so.
10.	FX .	DOOR SLAMS.
11.	NINA	Brian said you were obstinate. Well I am just going to have stand in front of this door and stop you leaving until it's all over, and then he can make a choice between us!
12.	CLARE	And just how do you intend doing that?

1. NINA

I think I know a way. You see Brian told me a lot about you. About your selfishness, your arrogance, your total disregard for other people's feelings. About the disgusting hairs on your toes that you refuse to cut because you regard letting them grow wild as a feminist gesture.

2. CLARE

If you don't leave, I shall call the police.

3. NINA

Brian also told me about your recently acquired most precious possession. And goodness me, here they are, proudly displayed on the dresser; Your limited edition, spode china collection of plates featuring the heads of all the post-war Labour Party leaders.

4. CLARE

Please, not the Spode!

5. NINA

Who's this then?

6. CLARE

Put that down!

7. NINA

SCENE 10: INT. THE REGISTRY OFFICE. MORNING

THE CONGREGATION ARE FINISHING A SONG, "STAND DOWN MARGARET" BY THE BEAT.

1. CONGREGATION (SING)

... I say stand down margaret

Stand down please

Stand down margaret

Stand down, Margaret, Stand down, please, stand down Margaret.

I say, stand down Margaret, stand down please, stand down

Margaret.

2. FX THE CONGREGATION SIT/SHUFFLE DOWN

- 3. GAVIN So, where is she, then?
- BRIAN Oh, be quiet.
- 5. GAVIN I shall be sending your details to registry offices throughout the country, just in case you're thinking of pulling this little trick again.
- 6. REGISTRAR You're not helping, Gavin. Mr.Harris, you have to understand that a Registry Office is like Gatwick. We can keep the other weddings in a holding position, but we can't do it forever.
- 7. BRIAN Just a bit more time, please. Has anyone managed to get hold of Helen?
- 8. LIBBY Her phone is off.
- 9. MEGAN She's probably face down under a hedge somewhere.
- 10. RAY I think the three of us should go round to the flat.

- 1. BRIAN OK, but hurry up and try and come back with my bride!
- 2. GAVIN Or just nip over to Heathrow and rustle him up a new one.

SCENE 11: INT. THE HOUSE. MORNING

NALI AND CLARE ARE WHISPERING

1. NALI	I say we rush her.
2. CLARE	We can't. She's holding Harold Wilson. Besides, as a care professional I feel I have a duty towards this poor woman who is clearly suffering under a delusion.
3. NALI	In love with Brian! That is not a delusion, that is crazy bonkers. No offence.
4. NINA	What are you two talking about? You'd better not be scheming! (YAWNS!)
5. NALI	Just chatting!
6. NINA	(YAWNS AGAIN) I do apologise for all this yawning, but Brian kept me up all night. He was insatiable, and very imaginative! In the end I had to say to him, "You keep going if you want, Brian, but I'm going to have to get some sleep".
7. NALI	Clare, may I ask you, without going into intimate details; Does this sound like Brian to you?
8. CLARE	WellHe's had his moments.
9. NALI	This floosy is getting on my nerves. What do you say, Clare, we rush her?
10. CLARE	No, Nali, I'm trained in this kind of thing. I am going to engage with her, be as honest and direct as possible, with her best interests at heart.

1. NALI	Whilst I creep round the back and hit her over the head with the
	clothes iron. Good idea.

- 2. CLARE Actually Nali, I don't think that'll be necessary. Look at her, sitting there, she can barely keep her eyes open.
- 3. NALI Her eyes are closed. Listen.
- 4. NINA THE GENTLE SOUND OF SNORING
- 5. CLARE She's asleep.
- 6. NALI Fast asleep. I suggest we follow the example of Uncle Pasha, who once crept up on a bear, in the wood. It was the terrible winter of 1987, and his family was starving. The bear was pre-occupied, doing what bears do in the wood...
- 7. CLARE Can it not wait?
- 8. NALI Why should it? It's a bear.
- 9. CLARE The story, Nali. Another time, perhaps.
- 10. NALI OK, I creep left, you creep right.
- 11. CLARE Here goes.

12. FX GENTLE FOOTFALLS AS THEY EDGE NEARER.

13. FX LOUD BANGING ON THE DOOR. CLATTER OF LETTERBOX.

14. HELEN Clare, it's me, Helen! Open the door! Brian's waiting at the registry office and I need to throw up!

SCENE 12: INT. THE REGISTRY OFFICE. MORNING

1. FX: REGISTRY OFFICE ATMOS

- 2. BRIAN She's stood me up, hasn't she? All we need is an altar, and the cliché would be complete. I am such a loser. And it's my own fault. She's found out about the woman in the bar and has decided that I'm not worth it. And do you know what, I think she's right.
- 3. BRIDE Yes, that's very sad, but we are trying to get married here.
- 4. GROOM Yes, come on, mate, it's our turn now.
- 5. BRIAN It's alright for you, your Bride showed up.
- 6. GROOM I know, I know, it must be tough.
- 7. BRIDE Terry, just get rid of him, will you.
- 8. GROOM All right, all right!
- 9. BRIDE We're an hour behind schedule as it is, and there's the high table ice sculpture to consider!
- 10. GROOM Come on, have a heart, Trudi, the guy is in pain.
- 11. BRIDE Yes, well so will you be in a minute if you don't get rid of him.
- 12. GROOM What's that supposed to mean?
- 13. BRIDE It means I'll give you what for, you soppy prat.
- 14. GROOM Look, it's not my fault that I've got a fully functioning human heart.
- 15. BRIDE And I haven't?

1.	GROOM	No! This flaming wedding has drained all the humanity out of you!
2.	BRIDE	(BURSTS INTO TEARS) Dad, Terry's being horrible to me.
3.	DAD	Upset my Princess, would you! I knew you weren't good enough for my little girl!
4.	GROOM	Keep out of this, Stan, you silly old fart.
5.	DAD	Right, you've had this coming to you.
6.	FX	A FIGHT BREAKS OUT, NOISILY – CAST + FX
7.	SIMON	(APPROACHING) I can't get hold of Libby, Helen, Megan, Ray, Clare or the rest of the guests. I'm the only one left, shall I pop round. I mean, you seem to have things covered here.
	SIMON	Clare or the rest of the guests. I'm the only one left, shall I pop

2.	CLARE	We have to do something!
